Common Adjectives for Describing People

- - Appearance: tall, short, slim, chubby, young, old
- - Hair: curly, straight, blonde, brown, black
- - Personality: friendly, kind, smart, funny, hardworking
- Example: 'She is tall and has curly hair.'

Common Adjectives for Describing Places

- Size: big, small, spacious, tiny
- - Environment: quiet, noisy, crowded, peaceful
- Weather: hot, cold, rainy, sunny
- Example: 'The park is big and peaceful with many trees.'

How to Form Descriptive Sentences

- - Use 'is' for singular and 'are' for plural.
- - Order: Subject + verb + adjective + noun.
- Example: 'The house is big and beautiful.'
- Example: 'My teacher is kind and helpful.'

Practice Conversation Example

- **Describing a Person**
- Person A: 'Can you describe your best friend?'
- Person B: 'Sure! She is tall, has curly hair, and is very friendly.'
- **Describing a Place**
- @ Person A: 'How is your hometown?'
- Person B: 'My hometown is small but very beautiful. It has a peaceful atmosphere with a lot of trees.'
